So, Ron ended the meeting by ringing the bell and said...”see ya next year”. Our first meeting in January will be on Wednesday the 13th.

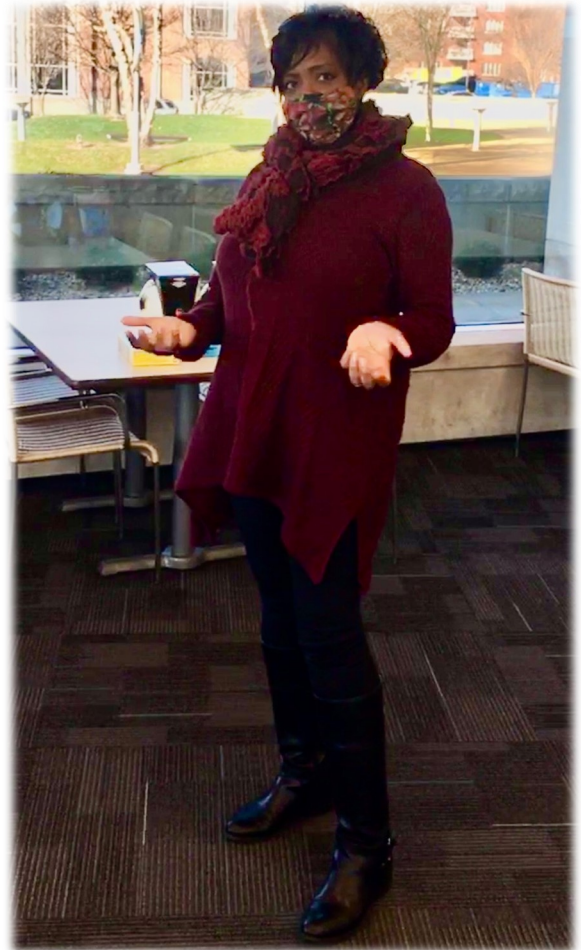
