We had several donate conscience money...we collected 17 bucks. Just about everyone gave.

Our speaker today was Jennifer Kerns with the Evansville Christian Life Center. The Evansville Christian Life Center was formed over 30 years ago to help those struggling in poverty. When a nearly 100-year-old monastery building was given to Bethel Church in 1986, our work of restoring people from need to potential in Christ began. Jennifer started her presentation discussing the Covid virus. For them, it was sort of a good thing. It helped them evaluate their programs. For example, they were serving 500 to 600 hot meals per day. They had to shut the operation down March 20, 2020 due to the virus. After they reopened, they only had a few people show up. They surmised they were staying home and not getting out. Consequently, they canceled the program. They did start a food bank program where a family can receive two weeks of food for \$20. Another program is medical and dental care from a building donated to them by CFC Church. It is located on Evansville's eastside on Bellemeade Avenue.

In addition they have a clothing bank for needy people. Also, they have a 16-week program (GAIN) to help individuals better their lives by helping them learn to remove barriers to success.
