## Spotlight on Our Speaker: Gelinda Mascoe and the Haitian Center of Evansville

Our featured speaker, Gelinda Mascoe, Executive Director, brought warmth and insight as she shared the mission of the Haitian Center of Evansville. Founded just two years ago, the center was created to support the nearly 10,000 Haitian immigrants who now call our region home.

Their purpose? To provide **training**, **resources**, **and connections** that empower Haitians to live independently, thrive economically, and integrate more easily into the Evansville community. This isn't just support—it's strategy and compassion in action.



They've already formed **partnerships** with schools, the **Evansville Police Department**, and a range of community organizations. Their ever-growing list of **classes and workshops** includes:

- **Computer literacy** (because opening 14 browser tabs is a modern survival skill)
- Resume writing (and how not to list "watching Netflix" under "Skills")
- Parenting classes
- Healthy living and financial literacy
- Haitian cultural events that bring the flavor, music, and spirit of Haiti to our community
- Cultural training to help bridge understanding between neighbors

It's inspiring to see such impactful work happening in our backyard. Gelinda's message reminded us of the power of community, connection, and cultural compassion. It's safe to say she left our club a little smarter and a whole lot more optimistic.
