







Announcements, Events, and Chicken Logistics

Speaker Spotlight: Beth Paul and the Mission of Little Lambs



Our very own **Beth Paul** gave an inspiring presentation about **Little Lambs**, the nonprofit that's been clothing babies and warming hearts since before smartphones were a thing.

Since 1995, Little Lambs has helped safeguard the health and well-being of our youngest and most vulnerable citizens, infants and young children. Little Lambs has accomplished this indirectly, but effectively, by creating alliances with professional organizations that provide prenatal and pediatric care, behavioral services, nutrition, drug and alcohol education and rehabilitation, and more.

Founded over 30 years ago by the **Junior League at First Presbyterian Church**, Little Lambs rewards parents for doing good things—like going to doctor appointments, parenting classes, or not naming their baby "Khaleesi"—with **vouchers**. These can be used at their downtown **baby boutique** for essentials like:

- Car seats
- Strollers
- Safety gates
- Diapers
- Breastfeeding supplies
- And all things cute and tiny.

2023 Stats:

- Helped 950+ families
- Performed 200+ car seat inspections
- Gave away 200+ new seats
- Staffed by one amazing Director and a tribe of dedicated volunteers

Beth also mentioned that **donations of gently used baby/children's clothing** are always welcome. Bonus points if they come pre-washed and don't have weird smells.
