Some tips Ben gave us included never to give personal information such as social security unless you initiated the call and know you have the right agency. If a caller asks you to send money to pay taxes, don't do it. Limited time offers should not requires a decision right then, be suspicious of anyone who tells you not to discuss an offer with anyone else.
